No motion was made.

It was brought to discussion to encourage increased involvement at the Federation meetings including one delegate from each of the club. In addition, Cheryl is going to work on putting together yearly binder to have each club have a clearer idea of the activities that occur.

Deb Primmer brought up that she was approached regarding providing food for the Amish Horse Auction, which takes place on April 29, 2017 at the Fair Grounds. The attendance for this event could be up to 1,000 people. Discussion was made regarding providing one standard meal for \$5.00 to keep it simple. This would involve some help from individual club members so it was decided to bring this back to the clubs for feedback.
