





Reminder Poultry Members: It is time to think about getting your pre-showing requirements completed in order to show at the Vernon County Fair. As you purchase your birds, please purchase them from a NPIP Certified Flock. If you have no other birds on your premises, please send in the Associate Flock Application to the WI Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. This form can be obtained at http://datcp.wi.gov/Animals?Poultry/Index.aspx. WI DATCP will then

send you an Associate Flock Certificate which you will need to enter your birds to the Vernon County Fair. If you have other birds on your premises, your flock will need to be tested for Pollorum Typhoid disease. This disease is caused by Salmonella Pullorum. This disease is highly fatal to young chicks or pullets, causing young birds to die soon after hatching without exhibiting any observable signs. Mortality in such outbreaks may approach ninety percent if left untreated. I plan to do the Pullorum Typhoid testing in July of this year. Please contact me at 608-606-3353 or home 689-2633 or email bnigh@vernoncounty.org to schedule your needed testing. If you have any questions regarding your poultry, please feel free to contact me.

Vernon County Fairest of the Fair 2016 Official Entry Rules

Entry Deadline: Monday, July 18, 2016 by 4:30 pm to the Vernon County Extension Office, Erlandson Office Building, 318 Fairlane Dr., Suite 392, Viroqua, WI, 54665. No late applications will be accepted.



<u>Contest Date:</u> Saturday, July 30, 2016, with interviews beginning at approximately 8:00 am. Selection will take place at the Ferris Wheel Pancake Breakfast. Additional details about the event will be sent to the applicants.

Requirements:

- Applicant must be a resident of Vernon County, or the majority of their fair activities take place in Vernon County, and a Wisconsin resident for at least one year prior to application.
- Applicant must be 18 years of age by January 1, 2017 and possess a valid driver's license, as the applicant may be required to travel.
- Applicant must be able to attend the Vernon County Fair, September 14-18, 2016. Applicant gives permission to have their photo published on the Vernon County Fair website, in newspapers, and in the Vernon County Fair official premium list.

Responsibilities:

- Vernon County Fairest of the Fair must be able to represent Vernon County in the Wisconsin Association of Fairs *Fairest of the Fairs* state contest held January 8-11, 2017. Two banquet tickets for the state contest will be provided by the Fair Board.
- The Vernon County Fair Board reserves the right to ask the Fairest representative to step down from their position if their behavior and actions do not portray a positive image for the Vernon County Fair and the county's youth. The Fair Board provides an expense allowance for activities as Fairest of the Fair.
- **To Apply:** Find a sponsor for the contest such as a business, youth organization, or civic organization. The sponsor fee is \$30.00 which covers one breakfast ticket for the sponsor, one ticket for the applicant and contest expenses. Sponsor checks should be written to the Vernon County Ag Society. Complete the entry form and submit to the Vernon County Extension Office. Please include two photos, with name and address written on the back for newspaper use. Photos will be returned to you. The public is welcome to attend the Ferris Wheel Pancake Breakfast on Saturday, July 30th from 7-11 am with the selection of the 2016 Fairest at approximately 10:00 am.

Baking With Lindsey

Hello everyone! I know we have all had our ups and downs while baking, so below I have listed my top ten pieces of advice. These tips will help you become a better baker! I have learned everything I know about baking from practice, advice from others, and never giving up. I hope this helps, good luck!



Always read the recipe all the way through before you start baking. Then you will be familiar with the recipe and have an idea what is going to happen next.

- Make sure to have all your ingredients you need before you start baking. It is not fun to have to stop in the middle of baking to run to the store.
- Take your time when measuring all your ingredients. Baking is a science, so you want to measure correctly!
- Do not overmix your batter.
- Resist the urge to open the oven door to check on your baked goods. Use the oven light if you want to sneak a peek.
- Take your cupcakes or cake out of their pans to cool.
 Your baked goods will continue to cook if left in the pans.
- Allow your baked goods to completely cool before frosting them. Be patient or you will have a melted mess if you do not wait.
- To keep your cupcakes moist make sure to frost the entire top of the cupcake.
- Research how to properly store your baked goods so you can enjoy them longer.
- Plan ahead! Take your time! And never give up!



Ingredient Substitutions

Have you ever been in the middle of making a recipe and realize you are missing an ingredient? These substitutions may just save you from ruining the recipe or help you avoid an extra trip to the store!

- Mayonnaise (1 cup) = sour cream or plain yogurt (1 cup)
- **Garlic** (1 clove) = 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder
- **Buttermilk** (1 cup) = 1 cup milk + 1 Tablespoon white vinegar
- **Tomato Juice** (1 cup) = 1/2 cup tomato Sauce + 1/2 cup water
- **Tomato Soup** (10.75 oz. can) = 1 cup tomato sauce + 1/4 cup water

Nutrition Basics

Every five years, a new edition of the Dietary Guidelines is published. The purpose is to provide recommendations for Americans on healthy eating patterns to promote health and prevent chronic disease.

Key Recommendations

- Vegetables—Eat a variety of vegetables, dark green, red and orange, legumes (beans and peas), starchy, and other.
- Fruit—Eat a variety of fruits, especially whole fruits.
- Grains—Consume at least half of all grains as whole grains.
- Dairy—Increase intake of fat-free or low-fat milk and milk products, such as milk, yogurt, cheese, or fortified soy beverages.

- **Protein**—Choose a variety of protein foods, which include seafood, lean meat and poultry, eggs, beans and peas, soy products, and unsalted nuts and seeds.
- Use oils to replace solid fats where possible.
- Limit saturated fats, trans fats, added sugars and sodium.

Easy Roasted Vegetables

Try this recipe in the oven or on the grill.

- 5 cups assorted vegetable pieces cut in chunks, (potatoes, sweet potatoes, winter squash, turnips, carrots, onions, mushrooms, asparagus)
- 1 tablespoon oil (canola or vegetable)
- 2 teaspoons dried Italian seasoning
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1. Heat oven to 425°F. Line a 9"x13" pan with aluminum foil or create a foil packet for use on the grill.
- Spread vegetables in pan or in foil packet. Sprinkle oil on vegetables. Stir. Sprinkle with Italian seasoning, pepper, and salt. Stir. For grill—Fold sides of foil together tightly to seal.
- 3. Bake uncovered 45 minutes. Turn every 15 minutes. **OR** Grill over medium-high heat about 15-20 minutes or 8-10 minutes on High. Turn once.
- 4. Serve hot. Open grill packet carefully to allow steam to escape.

Nominate a Volunteer from your County for the National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award

Wisconsin has many outstanding volunteers: Here is your opportunity to nominate someone from your county to be considered for the Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award or the Volunteer of the Year Award. The descriptions of each category are below. Each year, state 4-H programs are invited to nominate two outstanding individual volunteers—one in each of two categories:

- The Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award is given to an individual who has spent 10 or more years volunteering for 4-H.
- The Volunteer of the Year Award is given to an individual who has volunteered for 4-H less than 10 years. Selection Criteria
- 1. The **Volunteer of the Year Award** is for individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for less than 10 years at the local, county, district or state level.
- 2. The **Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award** is for individuals who have served 10 or more years at the local, county, district or state level.
- 3. A completed nomination will consist of an overview resume of the applicant's 4-H and relevant community volunteer experiences and three (3) letters of recommendation. A template for the resume is provided and should be followed in developing the nomination packet. A packet missing any of the four components is eliminated (resume & 3 letters).
- 4. Nominations/letters of recommendation must address the following selection criteria:
- Positive impact the nominee has had on the lives of 4-H youth
- Demonstrated ability to work with young people in a way that promotes youth empowerment, decision-making, problem-solving, meeting challenges, mastery.
- Nominee's dedication to youth/adult partnerships and mentor-learner relationships
- Nominee's innovative approaches to engaging youth and increasing diversity among participants
- Dedication to a safe and inclusive environment
- Nominee's innovative approaches to performing volunteer service, recruitment of additional volunteers, partnering with other youth serving agencies, fundraising, providing other resources for 4-H, advocacy for 4-H, etc.
- Nominee's innovative approaches to performing volunteer service
- Evidence of professional attitude, character, and morals
- Personal growth from being a 4-H volunteer (that you have observed)

Letter writers should be aware of the scorecard and address the relevant points in developing their documents. Application Guidelines

- 1. Application materials must be submitted by a nominator to the nominee's State 4-H Office. Each State 4-H Office will select one nominee for each category from its pool of nominations, to be submitted for the regional award. Two recipients will be selected from each region; one for each category mentioned above. From the eight regional winners, one person from each category will be named the national award recipient.
- 2. Each completed application must be accompanied by three letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation should be written by individual who can best describe the nominee's qualifications such as 4-H youth participant, another volunteer, 4-H staff person. Letters should be no longer than 2 pages in length, in 12-point font with 1-inch margins.
- 3. A resume of 4-H experiences and community service must be included and should follow the template provided. It is limited to 2 pages in length, in 12-font with a one-inch margin.

A photo entry is a single, color or black-and-white digital image. Photo's are to be submitted electronically to your county 1st. Typical files are between 5M or 10M jpeg or tiffs. The State 4-H Photo Committee will attempt to display images as uploaded, without correction, but may need to adjust large images to a smaller size to fit the display.

Photo entries are not returned to exhibitors and become the property of the State 4-H Office.
