We expect professional behavior from all applicants throughout the entire application and interview process. All Trip Award Applications are due to the UW-Extension Office by *November 1*st.

Trip Awards and Qualifications

Citizenship Washington Focus – Washington D.C. Vernon Co. Delegates = 2

Approximately 200 Wisconsin 4-H Youth are selected to attend this leadership program held at the National 4-H Center in Washington D.C. Participants learn the importance of civic and social responsibilities, as they relate to the development of better citizens and leaders. The week consists of participatory workshops, speakers, committee work, tours, and social events.

Qualifications:

- 10th-12th grade at time of selection. Minimum age 15 during trip.
- Be selected at the county level.
- Carry county approval through time of award trip.

Costs:

The total fee for CWF trip is approximately \$1,200. (Fee dependent on bus/fuel costs).

National 4-H Congress – Atlanta, Georgia

<u>Vernon Co. Delegates = 2</u>

National 4-H Congress is the flagship event of the 4-H program. For over 89 years, youth from around the United States and its territories have participated in this youth leadership development conference. The Congress provides youth with a quality educational and cross-cultural experience that exceeds what any state independently provides. It is designed to address the needs and issues of youth while helping to develop capable, competent, and caring citizens. Approximately 1,300 members of 4-H Youth Development Programs from around the country and Puerto Rico gather in Atlanta, Georgia to learn new skills in leadership, community service and multi-cultural integration. In addition to attending assemblies and workshops, they participate in discussion groups on issues facing our country today and moderate a town hall meeting at which they share the results of those discussions.

Qualifications:

- Be in 10th-12th grade at time of selection. Maximum age 18 as of January 1st.
- Be selected at the county level.
- Carry county approval through time of award trip.

Costs:

• The total cost of the National 4 H Congress is approximately \$1,200.

National 4-H Conference − Washington D.C.

<u>Vernon Co. Delegates = 1</u>

Six youth are selected to attend this working conference held at the National 4 H Center. Each participant selects an issue (for example - education, promotion, environment, violence, etc.) and works with other youth from across the country to develop plans that help direct future 4-H programming. Delegates spend the majority of time contributing to stimulating, task oriented groups. One day is spent on Capitol Hill meeting with legislators and touring.

Qualifications:

- Be in 10th-12th grade during the program. Maximum age 18 as of January 1st.
- Be nominated at the county level.
- Carry county approval through time of award trip.

Costs:

The total cost of the National 4 H Conference trip is approximately \$ 1,200.

National 4-H Dairy Conference – Madison, WI

Vernon Co. Delegates = 1

About 200 youth from 4-H dairy projects around the U.S. and Canada congregate in Madison, Wisconsin for the National 4-H Dairy Conference held annually in conjunction with World Dairy Expo. Participants learn about production, processing, marketing and use of dairy products, and develop a broader understanding of careers available in dairy production, biotechnology, genetics, marketing, and other selected areas. The conference consists of participatory workshops on the University of Wisconsin campus, speakers, tours, and visiting the World Dairy Expo.

Qualifications:

- Must have participated in the 4-H dairy project for at least three years, including the current year.
- Be in 10th-12th grade during the program. Maximum age 18 as of January 1.
- Have outstanding dairy accomplishment records.
- May not exhibit animals at World Dairy Expo or participate in National 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging Contest while at National 4-H Dairy Conference.

Costs:

• The total cost is TBD. Wisconsin 4 H Foundation supports a portion of the cost. The remainder is the responsibility of the delegate.

➤ WI State 4-H & Youth Conference – Madison, WI <u>Vernon Co. Delegates = 10</u>

Approximately 700 youth attend this educational event in Madison, Wisconsin each summer. Participants take part in educational seminars and assemblies and meet people from across Wisconsin. They are encouraged to take what they learn and share it with others in their home community.

Qualifications:

- Be in 7th-10th grade at the time of selection.
- Be a 4-H member or member of another Extension program.
- Carry county approval through time of award trip.

Costs:

The registration cost for Wisconsin 4 H & Youth Conference is approximately \$240.

Wisconsin 4-H Key Award

Vernon Co. Delegates = 1

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Selection should be based on an evaluation of the candidate's total 4-H record (membership, projects, activities, leadership, personal development and county 4-H and community involvement.).

Qualifications

 Be at least in 9th grade or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

Be actively involved in your 4-H club

- Pay for ½ the cost remember, if finances are a hardship, help is available! Contact the Extension Office, 637-5276 for confidential assistance
- Sell radio ads to area businesses as a way to promote 4-H opportunities and raise funds so future 4-H delegates can be awarded trips.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. I applied for a trip and just found out my Spanish Club trip is at the same time. What should I do?

• Contact the Recognition Committee as soon as possible to withdraw your application and/or to express interest in a different trip you qualify for.

2. May I apply for more than one trip?

• Yes, you may apply for more than one trip, but will likely only be awarded one. The 4-H Budget is taken into consideration when the number of delegates is decided.

3. Is Space Camp considered an award trip?

 No, Space Camp does not require a cover letter, resume, and interview. Space Camp is a specialty award trip requiring a registration form and a confidential 4-H Leader recommendation. Space Camp Selection is managed by the 4-H Educator.

4. My family can't afford to send me on a trip I am interested in. What should I do?

• Contact Colleen, 4-H Youth Development Educator, for a confidential discussion.

5. Do I have to pay my portion of the trip right away?

• If you're awarded a trip you will be sent a trip acceptance form which outlines expectations and payment due dates. Contact Colleen with any questions or concerns.

6. I want to apply for an award trip, but I am not sure when my church camp or drivers education will be. What should I do?

 Applying and interviewing for an award trip is a good experience, whether or not you choose to accept the trip.

7. Does the 4-H Educator select the award trip delegates?

No, that decision is made by the Recognition Committee, a group of three
 4-H volunteers who serve staggered three year terms.

8. Who should I ask to be my references?

 Non-related community members including teachers, coaches, advisors, mentors, and church leaders.

9. May I email my cover letter and resume?

 You should always use ink pen to sign (in cursive) your name. Email is unreliable and is discouraged.

10. I try hard in school, but I'm not on the honor roll. Can I still apply for a 4-H award trip?

• Yes, absolutely! Being an honor student is **not** a requirement to earn a 4-H award trip.
