

<u>Contest Date:</u> Saturday, July 29th, with interviews beginning at approximately 8:00 am. Selection will take place at the Ferris Wheel Pancake Breakfast. Additional details about the event will be sent to the applicants. <u>Requirements:</u>

• Applicant must be a resident of Vernon County, or the majority of their fair activities take place in Vernon County, and a Wisconsin resident for at least one year prior to application.

• Applicant must be 18 years of age by January 1, 2018 and possess a valid driver's license, as the applicant may be required to travel.

• Applicant must be able to attend the Vernon County Fair, September 13-17, 2017. Applicant gives permission to have their photo published on the Vernon County Fair website, in newspapers, and in the Vernon County Fair official premium list.

Responsibilities:

• Vernon County Fairest of the Fair must be able to represent Vernon County in the Wisconsin Association of Fairs *Fairest of the Fairs* state contest held January 7-10, 2018. Two banquet tickets for the state contest will be provided by the Fair Board.

• The Vernon County Fair Board reserves the right to ask the Fairest representative to step down from their position if their behavior and actions do not portray a positive image for the Vernon County Fair and the county's youth.

The Fair Board provides an expense allowance for activities as Fairest of the Fair.

The Commodity Carnival increases public understanding of the enormous value of agricultural commodities, highlights what it takes to manage business risks when taking commodities to market, and improves agriculture literacy across the nation. Additionally, it provides 4-H with the opportunity to showcase the life changing impact 4-H has on our nation's youth at major local events.

Commodity Carnival participants, youth AND adults, grow a commodity (this year, it's a steer) and sell it at market with a fun and educational game.

Nominate a Volunteer from your County for the National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award

Wisconsin has many outstanding volunteers: Here is your opportunity to nominate someone from your county to be considered for the Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award or the Volunteer of the Year Award. The descriptions of each category are below.

Each year, state 4-H programs are invited to nominate two outstanding individual volunteers — one in each of two categories:

• The Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award is given to an individual who has spent 10 or more years volunteering for 4-H.

• The Volunteer of the Year Award is given to an individual who has volunteered for 4-H less than 10 years.

I. Selection Criteria

1. The **Volunteer of the Year Award** is for individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for less than 10 years at the local, county, district or state level.

2. The **Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award** is for individuals who have served 10 or more years at the local, county, district or state level.

3. A completed nomination will consist of an overview resume of the applicant's 4-H and relevant community volunteer experiences and three (3) letters of recommendation. A template for the resume is provided and should be followed in developing the nomination packet. A packet missing any of the four components is eliminated (resume & 3 letters).

- 4. Nominations/letters of recommendation must address the following selection criteria:
- *Positive impact the nominee has had on the lives of 4-H youth.*

• Demonstrated ability to work with young people in a way that promotes youth empowerment, decisionmaking, problem-solving, meeting challenges, mastery.

- Nominee's dedication to youth/adult partnerships and mentor-learner relationships
- Nominee's innovative approaches to engaging youth and increasing diversity among participants
- Dedication to a safe and inclusive environment
- Nominee's innovative approaches to performing volunteer service, recruitment of additional volunteers, partnering with other youth serving agencies, fundraising, providing other resources for 4-H, advocacy for 4-H, etc.
- Nominee's innovative approaches to performing volunteer service
- Evidence of professional attitude, character, and morals
- *Personal growth from being a 4-H volunteer (that you have observed)*
- Letter writers should be aware of the scorecard and address the relevant points in developing their documents.

II. Application Guidelines

1. Application materials must be submitted by a nominator to the nominee's State 4-H Office. Each State 4-H Office will select one nominee for each category from its pool of nominations, to be submitted for the regional award. Two recipients will be selected from each region; one for each category mentioned above. From the eight regional winners, one person from each category will be named the national award recipient.

2. Each completed application must be accompanied by three letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation should be written by individual who can best describe the nominee's qualifications such as 4 -H youth participant, another volunteer, 4-H staff person. Letters should be no longer than 2 pages in length, in

12-point font with 1-inch margins.

3. A resume of 4-H experiences and community service must be included and should follow the template provided. It is limited to 2 pages in length, in 12-font with a one-inch margin.
