

#### What is Fall Forum?

Fall Forum is an opportunity for learning and networking for youth and adult volunteers. The sessions are interactive and provide practical ideas to use within a club, school, or community program. What's great is that youth and adults are learning together! Fall Forum is planned by a committee of youth and adult leaders from the Wisconsin Leadership Council and county staff. This year's forum offers over 25 educational workshops to choose from; plus, Friday night will have over 15 different interactive learning stations. The sessions are taught by teams of youth and adult volunteer leaders, county staff, and state specialists.

#### Who Attends Fall Forum?

Fall Forum is open to all adult leaders and youth leaders in 7<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> grade. Send a team of youth and adult leaders from your county. Staff are encouraged and welcome to attend. This is a great opportunity to network with other youth and adults across the state. Fall Forum is designed for youth, adults, and staff to take resources back to their county and community. Having a team helps with this process. All attendees will participate in an annual meeting Saturday afternoon. Wisconsin Leadership Council elections will be held Sunday morning. Youth and adults will be elected from each region. Counties will be asked to identify one adult and one youth as their voting delegates for the election process. These two individuals will caucus with their county/nation delegations to cast their vote. Youth and adults interested in applying for the Wisconsin 4-H Leadership Council need to complete an application and submit it by September 30. Both youth and adult applicants need a recommendation from the county 4-H Youth Development staff member. Applications are posted on the Wisconsin 4-H Leadership Council web page.

#### **How Do Participants Register?**

Registration is required for ALL PARTICIPANTS. Youth and adult leaders will register themselves using 4HOnline. Instructions for staff registration will be available the first week of September. **Registration is open September 6 through October 1**. There will not be an opportunity for any late or onsite registrations.

# Recognition Committee new member needed -3 year term, starts this fall Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H youth award trips and Key award recipients

The Recognition Committee is a subcommittee of the Vernon County Leader/Parent Federation. Any 4-H volunteer in good standing may serve as a recognition committee member. There are three representatives serving staggered three year terms so that a new member is joining the committee each year. The committee typically meets 2-3 times each year- after the application deadline to score paperwork and set up interview times, to conduct interviews and then to wrap up the year if needed.

# Scholarship Committee new member needed – 3 year term, starts spring of 2018 Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H Scholarship recipients

The Scholarship Committee shall consist of three members serving a term of three years. Thus, a new member will be selected each year by the Federation. The person with the most seniority shall serve as chairperson of the committee. Their responsibilities will include public relations, making scholarship forms available to applicants, naming the Selection Committee, and revising the form when deemed necessary. Please note: The Scholarship Committee may not be the same as the Scholarship Selection Committee. It is possible that an individual may be on both, but no parent of an applicant or anyone with close ties to an applicant shall be on the Selection Committee. The committee typically meets 1-2 times per year.

### Leader Parent Federation Officers Needed – 2 year terms

- --4-H Adult Volunteers with knowledge and experience in our county 4-H program, along with a willingness to learn, are well positioned to enjoy serving on the Federation.
- --An interest in serving all aspects of the county 4-H program, as opposed to a specific project, best serves our 4-H youth.
- --Consistent attendance is needed at the monthly 4-H Leader Parent Federation Meetings, which are generally held at the UW-Extension Office.
- -- Computer access and proficiency with Microsoft word and e-mail is essential.

#### **Vice President**

The role is a two year term, the first year being a support to the President of the federation and the second year to moving into the President role. Duties include: Filling in for executive officers that may not be able to attend a meeting, including leading the Federation meeting if the President is not able to attend. Serve as chairman of the promotion committee. Assist in providing 4-H officer training.

#### **Treasurer**

This position is a two year term. Duties include: Maintain accurate and up-to-date financial records of the 4-H Leader Parent Federation. Pay bills and make deposits as authorized by the approved annual budget. Provide monthly written financial reports at all 4-H Leader Parent Federation meetings, including committee balances. Assist in preparation of annual budget.

## National 4-H Week



#### October 1st—7th

What is now know as National 4-H Week began as an outgrowth of World War II. Following Pearl Harbor, it was decided to postpone holding the National 4-H Camp in Washington, D.C., until the cessation of hostilities. W. H. Palmer, State 4-H Leader in Ohio, soon after announced plans for a State 4-H Mobilization Week for Ohio as a means of focusing the attention of 4-H members on what they might do for national defense. This idea met with favorable response by State leaders throughout the country. As a result, the Federal Extension Service initiated National 4-H Mobilization Week which was observed annually in 1942, 1943 and 1944. The following year and each year since, it has been observed as National 4-H Week.

The focus during National 4-H Mobilization Week was on encouraging 4-H members to produce foods needed by rural men and women in the armed services; enlist as many young people eligible for membership as possible in all rural areas, particularly those living on farms, in some phase of the 4-H Club war program; to report on 4-H Club work which had already been started in terms of how it would contribute to family production and conservation goals and how it would contribute toward the total amount needed by rural men and women now in the armed services.

During this same period, the mid-1940's, a National 4-H Achievement Week was celebrated in November. This was a time to promote 4-H by emphasizing the accomplishments of that year and to recruit new members and leaders and plan for the next year.

After the war, when the National 4-H Mobilization Week became National 4-H Week, the purpose of the Week centered on (1) acquainting the public with the new, enlarged 4-H program, and the many ways young people may take part, (2) encourage more youth to join 4-H, (3) urge more men and women to volunteer as 4-H leaders, (4) recognize parents' contribution to 4-H and strengthen their cooperation, and (5) report the year's 4-H accomplishments and plan for the year ahead.

Results of this first National 4-H Week in 1945 indicated it had been a very effective means on the part of leaders and members alike, of reviewing the year's work, setting goals for the ensuing year, and focusing the attention of the public on 4-H and its values in the development of young people and to general community and national welfare.

In the early years, National 4-H Week was held in the spring. Beginning in 1968, National 4-H Week is now observed the first full week of October, beginning with the first Sunday of October. It may have been at the time of this change over of dates that the National 4-H Achievement Week became a part of National 4-H Week

# 4-H Today

Today, 4-H serves youth in rural, urban, and suburban communities in every state across the nation. 4-H'ers are tackling the nation's top issues, from global food security, climate change and sustainable energy to childhood obesity and food safety. 4-H out-of-school programming, in-school enrichment programs, clubs and camps also offer a wide variety of STEM opportunities – from agricultural and animal sciences to rocketry, robotics, environmental protection and computer science – to improve the nation's ability to compete in key scientific fields and take on the leading challenges of the 21st century.

# Vernon County 4-H Promotional Display Challenge

# October 22nd - 28th, 2017

# This is a voluntary Club Level Challenge

To better promote National 4-H Week, each club is challenged by the Vernon County 4-H Leader/ Parent Federation to create a window or promotional display in a business within their area of Vernon County.

- 1. Approach a business in your area that you feel would be willing to allow a display, preferably one with good public visibility. Explain the challenge and respect any specific rules/procedures the business would like followed.
- 2. <u>Send in the entry form to the extension office by Monday, October 16, 2017</u>, to allow time for coordinating the judging.
- 3. Create a unique, informative, and visually pleasing window (or display case) promotional display that shows the fun opportunities in 4-H, including any club level strengths or information you wish to provide. (Perhaps you can reuse portions of your fair booth display if appropriate)
- 4. Have the display completed by Saturday October 21, 2017, to celebrate 4-H in Vernon County.
- 5. Once displayed, email a picture and address/location to Cindy Daniels at the Vernon County Extension Office (cynthia.daniels@ces.uwex.edu).
- 6. By the end of the week, a team of judges (provided by the 4-H Emerald Club) will evaluate all displays according to the score guidelines.
- 7. Clubs are required to remove the displays at the end of the week, (October 28<sup>th</sup>) and thank the business for their support of Vernon County 4-H. We want to leave a positive impression, so they will continue to support future 4-H displays.

Each participating club will receive a \$25 thank you stipend and a certificate of participation. The winning club display will earn an additional \$25 and be named on a new award plaque displayed throughout the year at the Extension Office and later recognized at the Annual Recognition Banquet in January.

Health regulations prohibit us from serving cream or single-crust pies. Remember that members must be 12 years old to work in the 4-H Food Stand. # Suggested Exhibit Criteria for Vernon County Fair Vegetables Joanne Hornby, Vernon County 4-H Leader & Vernon Co. Fair Superintendent Do you plan on exhibiting vegetables at the Vernon Co. Fair?



- 1. Make sure you follow directions in the Fair premium List, especially the number required in the exhibit. For example: Class D Lot 1 3-Ripe Tomatoes
- 2. Always make sure your exhibits are cleaned, insect-free and blemish-free.
- 3. In some summers, the weather is not cooperative in helping you to produce ideal exhibits, but bring the best that you have.
- 4. If you know the certain variety, you may write it on your entry tag.
- 5. The term *diameter*, abbreviated as *dia* in the fairbook, is important. Make sure you know what it means.
- 6. Follow the instructions regarding the total number of entries allowed. For example: <u>Under class D: grades 3-5 limited to 6 entries.</u>

# Nominate a Volunteer from your County for the National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award

Wisconsin has many outstanding volunteers: Here is your opportunity to nominate someone from your county to be considered for the Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award or the Volunteer of the Year Award. The descriptions of each category are below.

Each year, state 4-H programs are invited to nominate two outstanding individual volunteers — one in each of two categories:

• The Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award is given to an individual who has spent 10 or more years volunteering for 4-H.

The Volunteer of the Year Award is given to an individual who has volunteered for 4-H less than 10 years

#### **Application Guidelines**

- 1. Application materials must be submitted by a nominator to the nominee's State 4-H Office. Each State 4-H Office will select one nominee for each category from its pool of nominations, to be submitted for the regional award. Two recipients will be selected from each region; one for each category mentioned above. From the eight regional winners, one person from each category will be named the national award recipient.
- 2. Each completed application must be accompanied by three letters of recommendation. Letters of recommendation should be written by individual who can best describe the nominee's qualifications such as 4-H youth participant, another volunteer, 4-H staff person. Letters should be no longer than 2 pages in length, in 12-point font with 1-inch margins.
- 3. A resume of 4-H experiences and community service must be included and should follow the template provided. It is limited to 2 pages in length, in 12-font with a one-inch margin.

Nominations are due no later than September 1, 2017.
