Registering for an event

Registrations for many activities, which includes camps and award trips are now done in 4HOnline!

Please see the below information on the registration process is done. FINDING THE EVENT

Log into your family account and look at your member list. Scroll to the bottom and find the section titled "Register A Member In An Event". Select the name of the member you want to register. Then select the event. A series of boxes will appear at the bottom of the screen. Click on the "Register" button.

REGISTERING FOR THE EVENT

On the next screen you will be asked for specific information related to the event. This may include t-shirt size, cabin or seminar choices, etc. Any required fields are in bold. Click on the "Continue >>" button. If you missed any required fields, you will get an error message and the missing fields will be highlighted. Verify your choices and click on the "Check Out >>" button. On the Payment screen, the only selection is County/Club 4H Check. Click on the "Select Payment Method" button. On the Confirm screen, check the box agreeing to the Pay By Computer Terms and Conditions. Click the "Confirm Order" button. On the Finish screen, you can print your entry.

This does not take place of required one on one interviews and application process held at the county level for certain events, such as award trips. The award trip application deadline of November 1st is fast approaching! Interested in applying and representing Vernon County 4-H as a delegate? The members online enrollment/re-enrollment for the current 4-H calendar year of 2018-2019 must be completed first! 

Recognition Committee new member needed -3 year term, starts this fall Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H youth award trips and Key award recipients

The Recognition Committee is a subcommittee of the Vernon County Leader/Parent Federation. Any 4-H volunteer in good standing may serve as a recognition committee member. There are three representatives serving staggered three year terms so that a new member is joining the committee each year. The committee typically meets 2-3 times each year- after the application deadline to score paperwork and set up interview times, to conduct interviews and then to wrap up the year if needed.

Scholarship Committee new member needed – 3 year term, starts spring of 2019 Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H Scholarship recipients

The Scholarship Committee shall consist of three members serving a term of three years. Thus, a new member will be selected each year by the Federation. The person with the most seniority shall serve as chairperson of the committee. Their responsibilities will include public relations, making scholarship forms available to applicants, naming the Selection Committee, and revising the form when deemed necessary. Please note: The Scholarship Committee may not be the same as the Scholarship Selection Committee. It is possible that an individual may be on both, but no parent of an applicant or anyone with close ties to an applicant shall be on the Selection Committee. The committee typically meets 1-2 times per year.

Leader Parent Federation Officers Needed – 2 year terms

- --4-H Adult Volunteers with knowledge and experience in our county 4-H program, along with a willingness to learn, are well positioned to enjoy serving on the Federation.
- --An interest in serving all aspects of the county 4-H program, as opposed to a specific project, best serves our 4-H youth.
- --Consistent attendance is needed at the monthly 4-H Leader Parent Federation Meetings, which are generally held at the UW-Extension Office.
- --Computer access and proficiency with Microsoft word and e-mail is essential.

Vice President

The role is a two year term, the first year being a support to the President of the federation and the second year to moving into the President role. Duties include: Filling in for executive officers that may not be able to attend a meeting, including leading the Federation meeting if the President is not able to attend. Serve as chairman of the promotion committee. Assist in providing 4-H officer training.

Secretary

This position is a two year term. Duties include: Shall keep minutes of the meeting of the General Membership and Federation Board meetings. The secretary shall work with the Extension Office in getting out special correspondence and communications as necessary.

Dairy Project News

Interested in learning more about the 4-H Dairy Project? Below is a list of 4-H Dairy project educational opportunities!

Badger Dairy Camp

This program for young people 12-18 features hands-on learning projects – fitting, showmanship fundamentals, dairy judging workshops, and dairy science-related workshops that focus on nutrition and reproduction – to teach campers the fundamentals needed to be successful in their dairy project work.

Dairy Project Training

Many counties hold local training for members and leaders in their favorite project areas, including dairy. Watch your county 4-H Family newsletter or contact your county Extension office for details.

Jim Crowley Memorial Award Interviews – High schoolers in grades 10 through 12 and enrolled in the 4-H dairy project are invited to apply for the James W. Crowley 4-H Dairy Leadership Awards. The deadline for applications or nominations for the 15 awards is July 15. Winners receive plaques and partial scholarships to attend the National 4-H Dairy Conference in September. The top two candidates will each receive \$500 awards for continuing their dairy education. The James W. Crowley Dairy Management and Extension Fund sponsor this 4-H dairy award program. Finalists will be interviewed at the Wisconsin State Fair.

National 4-H Dairy Conference

About 200 youth from 4-H dairy projects around the U.S. and Canada congregate in Madison for National Dairy Conference held annually in conjunction with World Dairy Expo. Participants learn about production, processing, marketing and use of dairy products, and develop a broader understanding of careers available in dairy production, biotechnology, genetics, marketing and other selected areas.

Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference

If you're in grades 8-10, check out the next Wisconsin 4-H and Youth Conference, scheduled each June at the UW-Madison campus. The conference offers educational seminars in most areas of 4-H. Contact your county Extension office for details. (See page 2 of this newsletter)

Wisconsin 4-H Area Animal Science Days

Series of four day-long events held around the state where youth in the beef, dairy, horse, sheep and swine projects increase their decision making skills and knowledge of animals through judging and grading experiences. Events include evaluation of dairy cattle, horses and meat animals; dairy showmanship contests; hippology (the study of horses); and oral reasons workshops. In addition, each site offers a variety of workshops for small animal projects, which may include rabbits, poultry, dogs, cats or llamas.

Wisconsin 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl

Dairy Bowl is a quiz competition where all the questions are about dairy topics. Teams compete in a double elimination format by giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. This website provides contest rules and registration forms.

State 4-H Dairy Cattle Judging Contest

Held in late July each year. Teams qualify through Area Animal Science Days. Top Senior Teams will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Dairy Judging Competitions at Louisville, World Dairy Expo and Harrisburg, PA.

Wisconsin State Fair

Various dairy-related events held at State Fair Park, West Allis, including the Wisconsin State Fair held each August.

SPEAKER: Frank Ginther & Eileen Van Dyk

In the field of Youth Development it is critical to utilize thoughtful and creative exercises that will greatly affect the growth and practice of strong Youth Adult Partnerships. Frank Ginther and Eileen Van Dyk have a combined number of 47 years in 4-H Youth Development work and teaching. Ginther holds a Master of Science in Agricultural Education from UW-River Falls and Van Dyk graduated from UW-Stout with a Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Science Education. They currently co-advise the seventh largest 4-H Youth Development Program in Wisconsin with nearly 900 members and over 200 adult volunteers. In addition, Ginther and Van Dyk reach another 3,000 youth across northwest Wisconsin in partnership and outreach educational work annually. This seasoned team of educators will be presenting on the importance of understanding, valuing, developing, and implementing Youth-Adult Partnerships.

Sunday Morning will conclude with workshops at the lab farm.



Arts & Crafts

All 4-H members can enter Arts & Crafts at Arts Fest. even if you are not enrolled in an Arts & Crafts project! You may enter two (2) arts & crafts items. You must attach a 3x5 card to each entry with the following information: your name, club's name, grade, date completed and a brief description of materials used and work done to make the art or craft. Be sure to write legibly! Attach card to your item (s) securely but not in a place that will distract or cover the appearance of your article. All items are to be brought to Westby High School Cafeteria by the exhibitor. There are (3) divisions: K-2, 3-7 & 8-13. Entries need to be in place by 8:30 am, on the day of the festival, to be judged and for display. Judge may be available after 11:30a.m.for comments and feedback.

Pre entry for Arts & Crafts is required and is included on the 4-H Arts entry form. Arts & Crafts are to be displayed at the club level in <u>February</u>.

<u>Make sure and pick up your entries at the "end" of the day!</u>

Photography

Limit of two (2) photos per exhibitor. Photos must be 5"x7" and mounted on poster board, (any color) measuring 6" x 8". A 3x5 card *must* be attached, with your name, club's name, grade and title of photograph. Arts & Crafts & photography entries are to be brought to the Westby High School Cafeteria on festival day, (8:30 a.m.) by the *exhibitor* for judging and display. Arts & Crafts has three divisions: K-2, 3-7 & 8-13. Pre entry for photography is required and is included on the 4-H Arts form. Photography is to be displayed at the club level in February. The Judge will be available after 11:30 a.m., on the day of the Arts Fest for comments. Make sure and pick up your entries at the "end" of the day!

<u>Speaking Pieces (individual or two people):</u>

Your club leader will turn in a roster of performers for Arts Fest by *January 25h*. All speaking pieces need to be performed at your 4-H club during the month of *February*. Read the rules carefully.

Musicals, Dramas, Play Readings, Mini-Dramas & Full Dramas:

Also to be performed at the club level and then compete at the County level. Read the guidelines carefully! Again, the rules are very specific, so please read them before you make a group selection. As with Speaking Pieces entries need to be turned into Leaders prior to the January 26th deadline & performed at the club level in February.

Question: What entries will be judged as a "fair entry"?

Answer: Demonstrations, vocal, piano & instrumental are performed for members grade 3 -13, on the same day as County Arts Fest and are considered fair entries.

Question: Where do I turn in fair & arts fest entries?

Answer: All entries are turned into your 4-H club leader.

Question: When is the entry deadline?

Answer: Entry deadlines for both fair & arts fest entries is January 25th.

Question: How will I find out my performance times?

Answer: The performance schedule will be posted the morning of Arts Fest. If you have extenuating circumstances re: time frame needs, please note this on your entry form.

Question: Can more than one entry be put on a form? Example—Siblings are entering the same events.

Answer: No. Individual entry form (s) must be completed.
