Please check with your club leader for your clubs rules regarding enrollment. Please Note! A 4-H member will not show "actively" enrolled until all fees have been paid to and "confirmed" by your club leader and subsequently turned into the Extension Office to be "accepted". Check with your club leader for club deadline. A \$5.00 late fee applies to all re-enrollments received by the Extension Office after November 15th deadline

Recognition Committee new member needed – 3 year term, starts this fall Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H youth award trips and Key award recipients

The Recognition Committee is a subcommittee of the Vernon County Leader/Parent Federation. Any 4-H volunteer in good standing may serve as a recognition committee member. There are three representatives serving staggered three year terms so that a new member is joining the committee each year. The committee typically meets 2-3 times each year- after the application deadline to score paperwork and set up interview times, to conduct interviews and then to wrap up the year if needed.

Scholarship Committee new member needed – 3 year term, starts spring of 2020 Focus: Assist in the annual selection process for 4-H Scholarship recipients

The Scholarship Committee shall consist of three members serving a term of three years. Thus, a new member will be selected each year by the Federation. The person with the most seniority shall serve as chairperson of the committee. Their responsibilities will include public relations, making scholarship forms available to applicants, naming the Selection Committee, and revising the form when deemed necessary. Please note: The Scholarship Committee may not be the same as the Scholarship Selection Committee. It is possible that an individual may be on both, but no parent of an applicant or anyone with close ties to an applicant shall be on the Selection Committee. The committee typically meets 1-2 times per year.

Leader Parent Federation Officers Needed – 2 year terms

- --4-H Adult Volunteers with knowledge and experience in our county 4-H program, along with a willingness to learn, are well positioned to enjoy serving on the Federation.
- --An interest in serving all aspects of the county 4-H program, as opposed to a specific project, best serves our 4-H youth.
- --Consistent attendance is needed at the monthly 4-H Leader Parent Federation Meetings, which are generally held at the UW-Extension Office.
- --Computer access and proficiency with Microsoft word and e-mail is essential.

Vice President

The role is a two year term, the first year being a support to the President of the federation and the second year to moving into the President role. Duties include: Filling in for executive officers that may not be able to attend a meeting, including leading the Federation meeting if the President is not able to attend. Serve as chairman of the promotion committee. Assist in providing 4-H officer training.

Treasurer

This position is a two year term. Duties include: Maintain accurate and up-to-date financial records of the 4-H Leader Parent Federation. Pay bills and make deposits as authorized by the approved annual budget. Provide monthly written financial reports at all 4-H Leader Parent Federation meetings, including committee balances. Assist in preparation of annual budget.

A DAY OF DAIRY!

WHAT IS A DAY OF DAIRY?

This is a full day, hands-on workshop geared toward beginning level youth excited about the dairy industry and working with dairy cattle. Those at a beginning level in the dairy project will learn everything from animal health, to all aspects of caring for cattle on farm and for a show. See the tentative schedule on the next page.

A Day of Dairy is open at no charge to any and all beginning level youth interested in learning more about dairy cattle and how to care for them who reside in Vernon County and are ages 9-19. Extra animals will be available for those who may not have one, provided we are notified ahead of time. Several door prizes will be given throughout the day and all attendees will receive a new calf pail and rope halter for coming.

*WHAT SHOULD YOU BRING?

Positive attitude

Desire to learn more about dairy cattle and the dairy industry

Your halter trained project animal (optional)

If you choose to bring your project animal, you are responsible for her throughout the day. Your animal must be broke to lead, healthy, and free of ringworm, pinkeye, etc. Any animals not meeting these requirements will not be permitted

Any clipping supplies you may have (if you have them)

Show halter

Closed toe shoes! And probably, a change of clothes (washing, clipping and water fight are on the schedule)

Vernon County Fair Dog Project Entry Reminders!

All Dogs must have distemper and rabies shots, and must be on a leash.

Dogs brought in for judging only, will not stay at the fair. All dogs must be checked by the veterinarian prior to the show with tag (current). All paperwork accompanying the dog will be given to the superintendent once in the barn. Proof of rabies and distemper vaccinations must be attached to the Animal ID Form, on entry day. Animal Check-In Procedures see Page 10 of the Vernon County Fair Book. Dog Show will be Sunday at 10:00 a.m. in the Livestock Arena. Exhibitor MUST have for display, a 4x6 photo of him/herself with pet mounted on 5x7 tag board. On front of tag board include your name and grade, dog's name, dog's age and breed. Please turn in by entry deadline, August 7th, 2019. Dogs must be shown with a chain or nylon training collar and a 6 foot long leather or nylon leash (No retractable leashes).

Small Animal, Rabbit & Poultry News Emery Bork

Small Animal Fitting Clinic:

August 11th (3:30-6:00) We will be gathering at the fairgrounds to offer a fitting and showing clinic for all interested youth. Goat project leaders will be there with their goats to show you clipping, washing, and trimming techniques. Sheep project leaders will be there with sheep to demonstrate ring set up, practice leading, and grooming. Poultry and rabbit leaders will be there demonstrating bathing, grooming, and clipping of poultry, and grooming, tattooing rabbits. You do not need to bring your animals from home. Leaders will allow you to work with their animals if needed. Please let us know if you will attend by either emailing Emery or marking on our Facebook event.

Rabbit and Poultry Barn Update for Vernon County Fair:

The rabbit and poultry will now be located in the Open Dairy Barn #1. The fair board decided to move them into the barn due to disease and pathogen concerns with stacking rabbits and poultry together. The turkeys will remain in the old poultry barn, again due to disease prevention. There currently is no testing antigen available for poultry, so this year, you do not need your birds tested in order to enter into fair. However, please have the proper identification and make sure to follow all other rules for entry concerning poultry in the fair book. Due to the fact that rabbits and poultry will be in the new barn, youth are responsible for care and cleaning for their rabbits and poultry throughout the duration of the fair. Rabbits will be housed by club, poultry will be housed by class entries. When moving your rabbits and poultry into the barns, please look for identification tags/areas designated for clubs/open classes. Please take time to sit down with other members of your club to design tags, displays, etc for your rabbit area. The new cages have been designed for display areas on top. There will be a herdsmanship award granted at the end of the fair to the club that maintains their rabbits, and poultry areas the best. We have set aside room to store your feed for the duration of the fair and will have rakes and buckets for manure disposal. We will also have cups for food and water available, as well as shavings for poultry. If you have any questions about the set up, feel free to contact our office.



Suggested Exhibit Criteria for Vernon County Fair Vegetables Joanne Hornby, Vernon County 4-H Leader & Vernon Co. Fair Superintendent Do you plan on exhibiting vegetables at the Vernon Co. Fair?

- 1. Make sure you follow directions in the Fair premium List, especially the number required in the exhibit. For example: Class D Lot 1 3-Ripe Tomatoes
- 2. Always make sure your exhibits are cleaned, insect-free and blemish-free.
- 3. In some summers, the weather is not cooperative in helping you to produce ideal exhibits, but bring the best that you have.
- 4. If you know the certain variety, you may write it on your entry tag.
- 5. The term diameter, abbreviated as dia in the fair book, is important. Make sure you know what it means.
- 6. Follow the instructions regarding the total number of entries allowed. For example: Under class D: grades 3-5 limited to 6 entries.

Helen Hornby embodied the ideals of 4-H through her life. As a young child, Helen was the first 4-H member to do seed trials for Wood County. This was the beginning of her life-long involvement in 4-H. Recognizing the value of 4-H to a community, Helen was instrumental in working with Extension staff in 1944 to form Kenosha county's first city 4-H Club. Urban 4-H Clubs are now found throughout the 4-H Program. Beyond family participation, Helen became a 4-H leader and advocate to ensure that all children, regardless of limitations or life circumstances could learn and grow through 4-H Youth Development.

Throughout Helen's 4-H career, she exemplified leadership in organizing activities, empowering volunteers, and sparking enthusiasm in Kenosha County, Vernon County, and beyond. She had a variety of leadership roles in 4-H focusing on the educational impact 4-H had at all levels. No matter what her role, she was concerned about providing a meaningful 4-H experience for youth.

Helen recognized the challenging job of the 4-H Agent and worked hard to support them. The 4-H Agents she worked with valued the perspective, experience, and ideas Helen shared as well as her willingness to "focus forward" as new programming initiatives were introduced. She was instrumental in getting volunteers involved to ensure a sustainable 4 -H program for the future.

Her service extends well beyond 4-H in that she was also active in church, civic, county, and state volunteer activities, always trying "to make the best better." 4-H shaped Helen's life as she whole heartedly lived the 4-H pledge, along with her family. She worked to think clearly, be loyal, serve others, and make her world a better place.
