During the classes, youth/adults will choose plants to fill their containers. The total cost of the plants and any additional figurines will be charged at the checkout counter, along with the \$10 course fee. So keep this in mind as you work with your youth to plant their fairy gardens/select a house plant. The greenhouse is located at 520 E Terhune Str, Viroqua, WI & classes are limited to 10 participants each.
